In 1995 while working as a firefighter with the Montgomery Fire Department during his downtime Tony became Microsoft Certified and added other technical certifications to his resume. A few years later he transferred to the City of Montgomery's IT Department as a Distributed System technician to assist with getting the City's computers Y2K Compliant..

His career then led him to a company headquartered in San Jose California where he was hired to relocate their data center operations from San Jose, CA to Montgomery, AL. After completing this contract he was then invited back to the City of Montgomery as its Network Manager during which

time he and his team began an effort to network all the City's remote location i.e. Police Department and its remote sites, Fire Department HQ and stations, the Landfill, 911 Center etc.

In December 2006 he began working as a government contractor where he served as an IT Project Manager/Program Manager that included projects such as Akamai for edge computing, NETCENTS for contract acquisitions and ITCC for computer acquisitions. He later transitioned back into private industry as a IT Project Manager.

In March of 2023 his career completed the full cycle as he was hired a third time by the City of Montgomery as its Chief Technology Officer.

His background includes over a decade of developing and scaling technology platforms, which now extends into the ISP space through projects like *Rapid5GS*, an orchestration layer for Open5GS that simplifies private 4G/5G deployments. Josh also plays an active role in fostering collaboration at MGMIX (Montgomery Internet Exchange), helping strengthen peering and connectivity across the state.
